Work experience and insight opportunities

Bookings are now open for the University of Cambridge 2023 Virtual Pre-University Summer Programme. The programme brings together Sixth Form students from across the globe to learn from academics and subject specialists. The two-week virtual programme combines subject specific lectures with sessions on study skills, careers and how to apply to a UK University. There will also be the opportunity to

Applications to attend the London International Youth Science Forum (LIYSF) are <u>now open</u> for students aged 16+. 500 of the best young science students aged 16-21 years old from over 70 countries around the world are set to attend the event, which takes place between 26th July-9th August and is based at Imperial College London. It will include four day visits to the best UK university laboratories (London, Oxford, Cambridge and UK), research centres and scientific institutions (students choose from over 55 visits), as well as four specialist lecture sessions across subjects such as Artificial Intelligence, Nanotechnology, Engineering, Robotics, Biology, Medicine, Chemistry, Physics, Maths and Astrophysics (choice of 32 lectures). ISSOS is one of the UK's longest-running summer schools, providing award-winning summer programmes at the universities of St Andrews, Cambridge and Yale for students from all over the world aged 13-18. The three-week programmes are fully residential and all-inclusive, and during their time students will choose one academic subject and one elective subject. Another summer school possibly of interest is <u>Oxford and</u> <u>Cambridge Tutors</u>, which features days on in-person tuition in the



style of an Oxbridge tutorial, plus lots of add-ons such as personal statement support and mock interviews.
